



MICHIGAN WOMEN IN MUNICIPAL GOVERNMENT BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The Michigan Women in Municipal Government is a state-wide organization of women serving in local government that strives to advocate on critical issues while encouraging women to get involved in local government; to educate members by providing them with resources, training, and mentorship opportunities; and to support women in government service and those who should be.

The MWIMG Board of Directors is comprised of five members that are tasked with administering and overseeing MWIMG initiatives.

Eligibility:

- Board members must be active MWIMG members in good standing.

Term:

- Each board member serves a term of two years.

Expectations and Responsibilities:

- Manage the activities of MWIMG
- Promote continuing education, networking, and support of opportunities for local women officials in Michigan
- Attend meetings in conjunction with the following events, as well as approximately four additional meetings held at the League Lansing Office:
 - March: MML Capital Conference, Lansing
 - September: MML Annual Convention, various locations around the state

Application Process:

- Nominations for positions are made by the nominating committee and may also be made from the floor at the meeting at which the election is held.
- To indicate interest in serving on the Board, interested candidates may notify Emily Kieliszewski (see contact information below).

Selection Process:

- Elections occur in each even-numbered year at the MWIMG meeting held during the MML annual Convention.
- Board members are elected by majority vote of the members present via secret ballot.
