Our Core Legislative Principles

Economic Security

A strong municipal finance structure provides stability within a community. When local governments have the resources needed, the result is quality services and infrastructure. Additionally, economic development, access to education, and training play a key role in creating job opportunities and promoting growth, allowing residents and the community to thrive. Supporting small businesses, entrepreneurs, and workforce training opportunities stimulates the local and regional economies and contributes to overall stability. By prioritizing policies advancing these aspects, we can work toward building a more secure economic foundation for everyone.



Our Core Legislative Principles (Cont.)

Infrastructure

Well-maintained local roads and bridges that incorporate multi-modal options ensure the smooth and safe mobility of people and goods. Robust transit investment and policies can break economic barriers, enhance the environment, and draw new businesses and residents. Water, sewer, and stormwater management policies are critical for delivering clean drinking water, managing wastewater, and preventing flooding.

Attainable housing promotes equality, allowing people of all abilities to live with dignity and independence. Quality infrastructure, in traditional and non-traditional forms, is the backbone of a thriving community. Advocating for policies that bolster sustainable and efficient infrastructure will help meet the needs of people and communities across Michigan.



Local Control

Community-specific solutions produce better outcomes. Policies that empower local leaders and residents to thoughtfully discuss and make decisions directly impacting the place they live foster greater civic engagement as well as a sense of ownership and accountability. The preservation of local control leads to tailored and practical solutions that address each community's unique needs and challenges.
